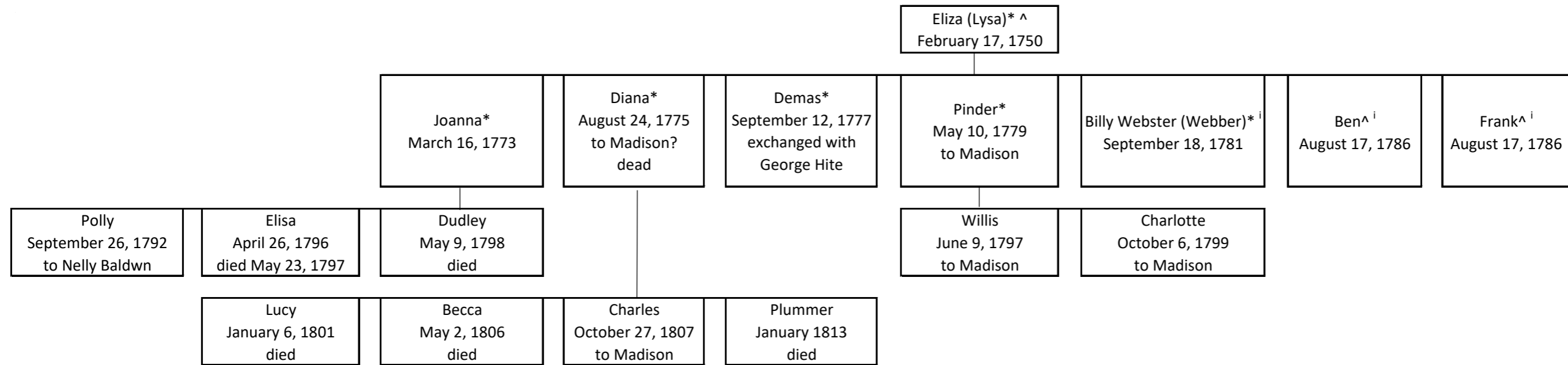

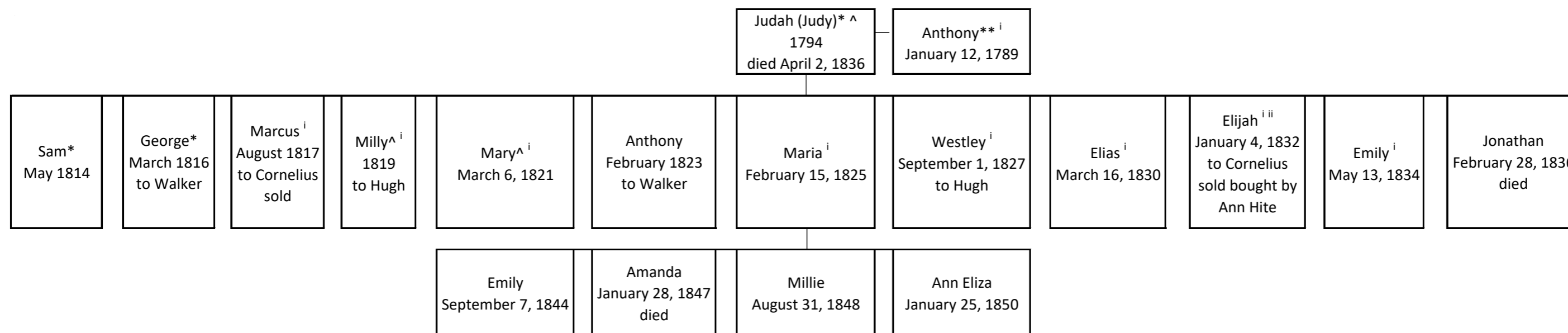

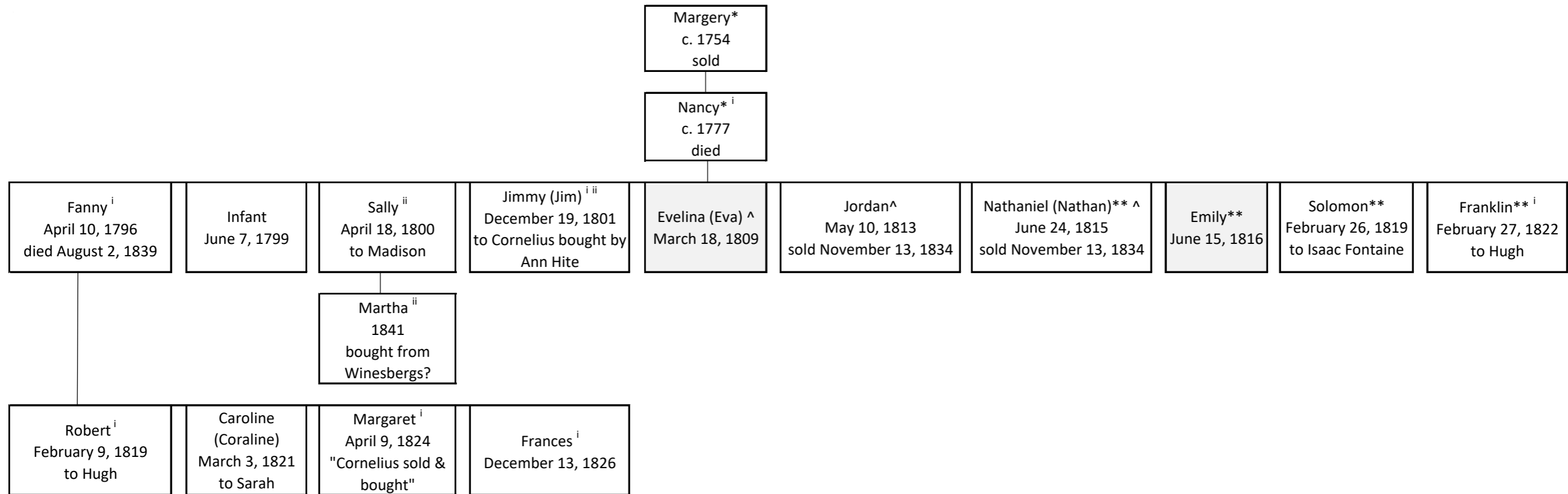

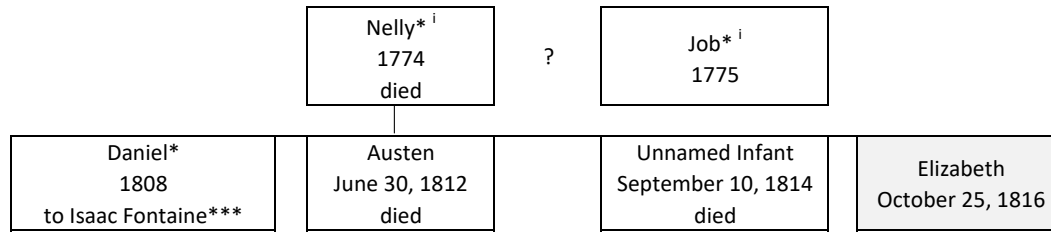
Family Trees of People the Hites Enslaved at Belle Grove

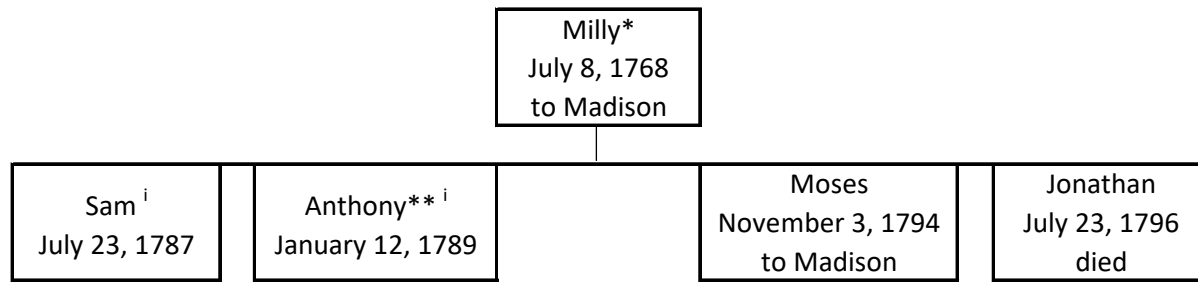

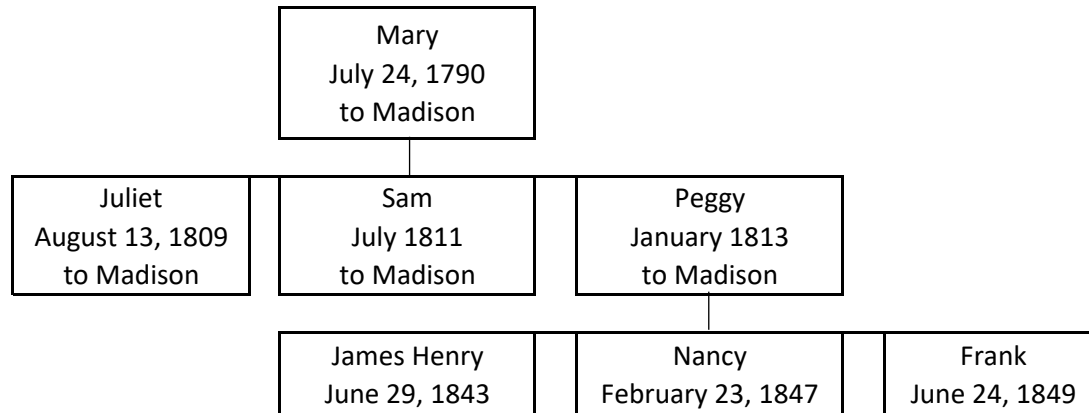

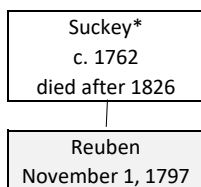

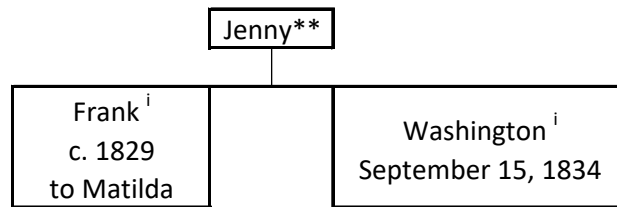

Family Trees of People the Hites Enslaved at Belle Grove



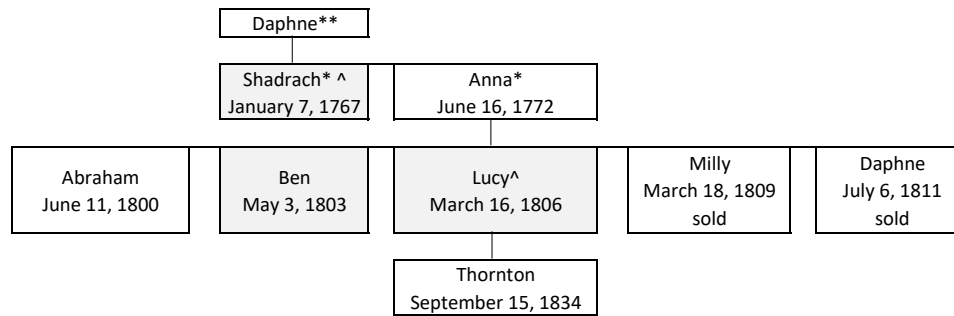

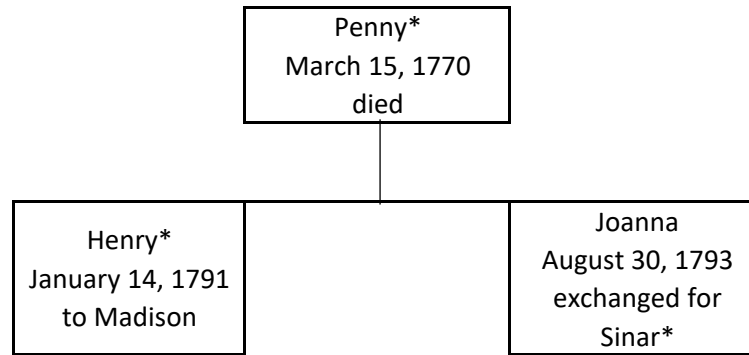

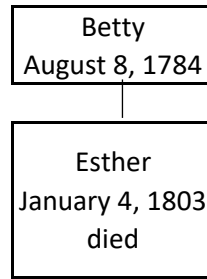

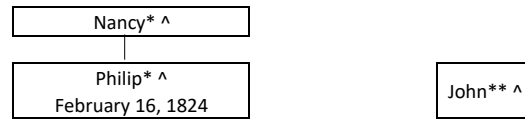

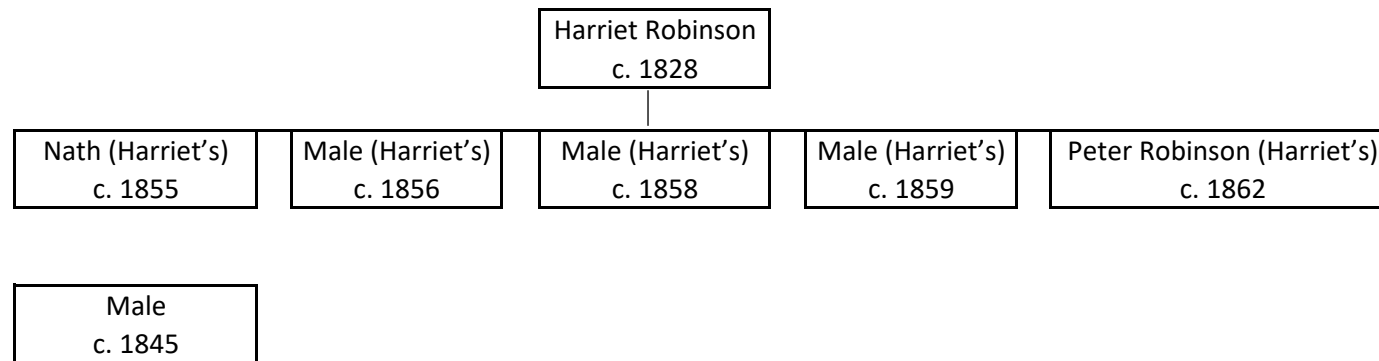
